BROWN COUNTY TRAFFIC SAFETY COMMISSION MEETING MINUTES

A regular meeting of the Brown County Traffic Safety Commission was held on Tuesday, October 10, 2023, at 9 a.m., at the Brown County Sheriff's Office, 2684 Development Drive, Green Bay, WI.

1. Call to Order

Chairperson Rousseau called the meeting to order at 9 a.m.

2. Introductions

None.

3. Citizen Appearances

None.

4. Old Business

a. Approve minutes from prior meeting

A motion was made by Flucke and seconded by Buchmann to approve the minutes from the last meeting on July 11, 2023. **Motion carried.**

b. Review/update any action items from previous meeting

None.

c. 172 Traffic Operation Review

Rousseau informed that speed enforcement was done by the Brown County Sheriff's Office on July 19 from 7 a.m. to 1 p.m. on 172, which resulted in 27 citations issued. Nineteen were going 10 MPH or more over the speed limit and four were going over 80 MPH. There were also 16 warnings given out. The construction on 172 is wrapping up.

Fontecchio suggested putting up speed feedback signs. He thinks they would be of value. Falk advised that the municipality would have to apply for them and be responsible for maintaining them. Rousseau stated that all three municipalities involved (Ashwaubenon, Allouez and Bellevue) would probably be in favor of it. Fontecchio will follow up on this, and it will be put on the next meeting's agenda.

5. New Business

a. Teen Driving—Governor Conference

Kovacic stated she went to the Governor's Conference on Highway Safety at the end of August and attended the impact teen driver session. She stated there is good data behind it. She is doing some brainstorming on where we can make the biggest impact in the community with it. She stated she is also a child passenger safety instructor and will be holding a training session in the spring.

Next week is Teen Driver Safety Awareness Week. Rousseau noted he heard on the news that the road test will be mandated again. Weissinger noted that teen driving predictive analytics show that teen drivers are the number one factor in crashes in four of the five hot spots in Brown County.

6. Work Zone Construction Safety

Falk gave an update on state projects:

- STH 32 northbound bridge replacement over CTH PP is done
- STH 32, W. Mason St./Beaver Dam Creek box culvert is done
- I-43, Leo Frigo Bridge arch painting is done
- STH 172 from the airport to I-43 should be done at the end of the month

He informed that next year's projects include:

- STH 54/57 from University Way to the 54/57 split, starting in April
- STH 96 from CTH JJ to CTH D, starting in May
- STH 172 from the airport to STH 54, starting in June

Fontecchio added that the Lineville Road project will be going on in 2024-25 and the South Bridge project starts in 2025.

7. 2023 Third Quarter Review of Fatal Crashes

Rousseau reviewed the fatal crashes in the third quarter:

- 07-01-23 Blake Rd./STH 96 (FTY at stop sign/suspected alcohol impairment)
- 07-21-23 Allouez Ave./Webster Ave. (2 fatalities, speed/alcohol, criminal charges filed)
- 07-31-23 Main St., Bellevue (pedestrian lying in the road and struck by two vehicles, under investigation, one driver identified)
- 08-01-23 Broadway/7th St. (minivan crossed centerline and struck semi, no alcohol)

8. Brown County Tavern League Updates

Hansen had nothing new to report.

9. Roundtable Discussion

Rousseau stated that about 50 more Flock traffic safety cameras will be added in the area. They are an excellent investigative search tool. He also stated another successful Frogger event was held recently, and he is working on getting the numbers from that.

Weissinger reported there have been 11 fatalities in Brown County so far this year, compared to 14 last year at this time. Statewide, there have been 420 fatalities so far this year, compared to 448 last year at this time. Motorcycle fatalities are up 26.8% from last year, with 90 fatalities so far this year, compared to 71 last year at this time. He also reported that Wisconsin now has a Judicial Outreach Liaison (JOL), Todd Meurer. He also advised that officers' narratives are important for crash data, and they should focus on the "what" and "how". He also stated that as part of Wisconsin's Safe Roads Challenge, there is a free mobile app called TrypScore that scores drivers in different driving categories. To incentivize safe driving, drivers can earn rewards and prizes and compete against each other. This app can be downloaded from an app store.

Flucke stated that one quarter of crashes occur during darkness, and with daylight fading this time of year, people need to be more aware of pedestrians and bicyclists, and pedestrians and bicyclists should also take safety measures in wearing reflective clothing and adding lights to bikes.

Buchmann said GBPD applied for a BOTS grant asking for an extra \$20,000 for speed enforcement next year. They didn't use up all the OWI money this year but did go over a little on the Click It or Ticket. Six school speed zone enforcement deployments were run in the county at the end of September, which resulted in 119 citations and 122 warnings. He also stated they were approached by a local railroad company advising that engineers have reported a lot of near misses and are requesting a cop on train deployment. He will look into Operation Lifesaver funding for this, or they may just do it themselves.

10. Next Meeting

The next meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, January 9, 2024, at 9 a.m.

11. Adjourn

A motion was made by Buchmann and seconded by Fontecchio to adjourn the meeting. **Motion carried.** The meeting adjourned at 10:21 a.m.
