### **NPC Monthly Report - August 2020**

**COVID-19** - Brown County Community Treatment Center has offered free COVID-19 tests to employees at a frequency of every other week since late May 2020. The rate has recently increased to weekly opportunity following positive clinic results. Within the month of July, two employees were found to have COVID-19 positive results through the clinic. One of the two employees sought confirmatory tests through their primary care provider. Remarkably, both confirmatory tests were negative for COVID-19, leading to suspicion of initial false positive. The second employee identified as positive for COVID-19 within July has been teleworking throughout the pandemic.

- A total of 686 COVID-19 nasal swabs have been collected through DQA/Exact Sciences initiative. Testing supplies, courier services and laboratory handling have been provided by DQA. Additional supplies have been obtained through local laboratories when residents/clients have displayed symptoms of COVID-19 needing expedited results. Employees that pursued COVID-19 testing within the community have not been counted in total number obtained.
- To date, there have been zero long-term care residents, crisis stabilization assisted living clients or inpatient psychiatric hospital clients found to be positive for COVID-19. The campus has been outbreak free within its residential care units. Healthcare employees continue a minimum of daily monitoring for COVID-19 signs, symptoms or complaints.
- Including the above reference, a total of four Brown County Community Treatment Center employees have been identified as positive for COVID-19 throughout the pandemic. These employees were quickly excluded from work until return to work criteria was met, along with other contact-tracing in partnership with Public Health.

**Regulatory Concerns** - A targeted infection control survey was conducted in July by the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid (CMS). The facility was found to be deficiency free. A second targeted survey may be conducted if there becomes a trend in facility reported long-term care resident outbreaks. On Wednesday, July 29<sup>th</sup> the Department of Health Services conducted an onsite follow-up investigation to a self-reported incident which occurred in February of 2020. There were no citations issued, and the nursing home was commended for its thorough investigation.

**Other Business** - Leading Age WI shared information about "point of care testing" through the White House Coronavirus Task Force. Healthcare facilities with a CLIA certificate of waiver may receive rapid COVID-19 testing instruments. The focus will be on rapid virus detection when there is evidence of COVID-19 symptoms. An onsite medical screening workgroup, tasked with the new building addition's medical assessment procedures, sent a survey to local partners seeking feedback about the drafted process and performing position. Workgroup members will be attempting to meet with local partners individually and virtually to further determine the community's acceptance. Genevieve Willemon, EMR Coordinator and Safety Committee Chair was selected to be the president of NEW HERC, Northeastern Wisconsin Healthcare Emergency Readiness Coalition.
