- Prevention Campaign advertisements went live on the Green Bay Metro Buses and in the Green Bay Press Gazette, as well as flyers around the community.

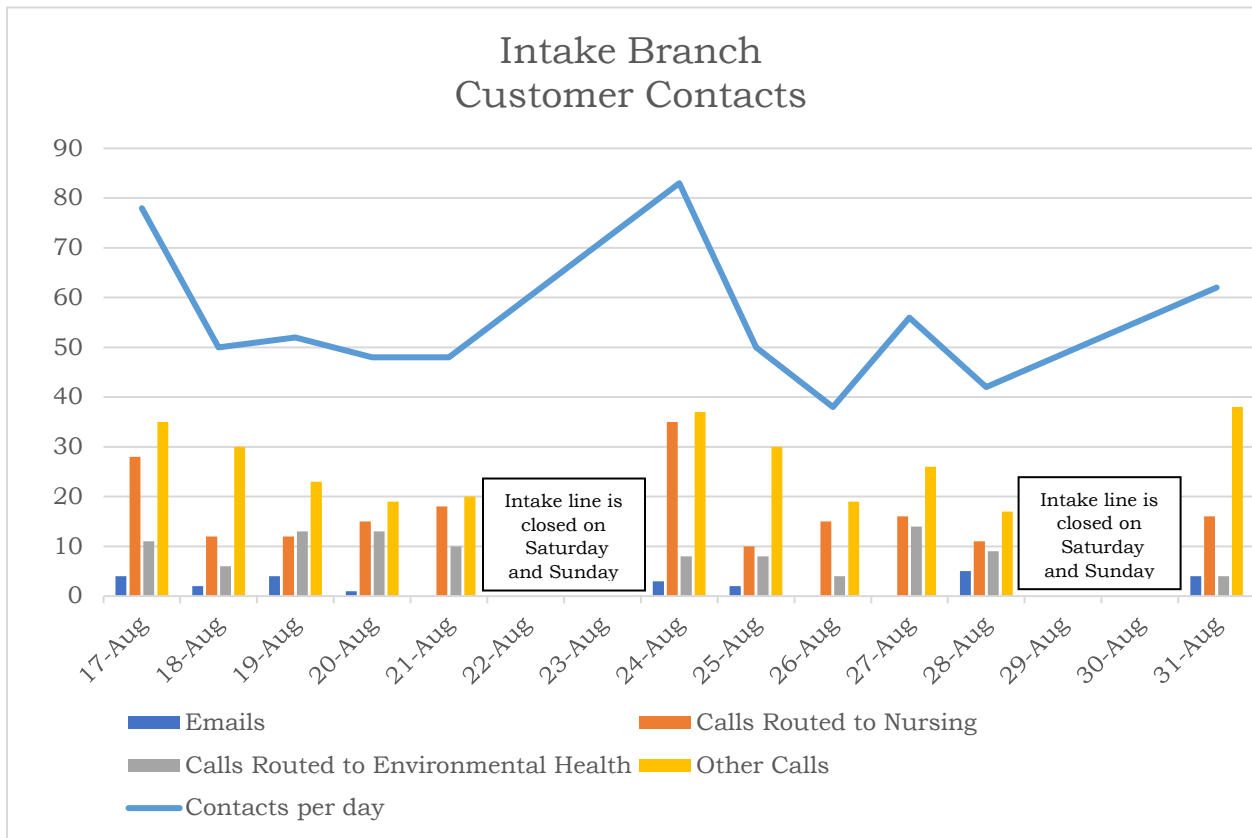
Upcoming Considerations

Consideration	Incident Command (IC) Response
Gaining voluntary compliance with health and safety recommendations	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Continued review of gating recommendations with consideration being given to local data and situation analysis. • Continued to push out clear messaging on our social media channels related to being a close contact, risk in attending large events, and how to properly wear a mask. • Distributed Prevention Messaging Campaign materials throughout the community on buses, newspapers, and flyers.
Improving internal processes and building capacity	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Continued to develop outbreak management protocols and with continuous quality improvements underway. • Cross-trained additional staff on WEDSS records staging and processing to reduce time taken to close out cases. • Posted contact tracing LTE positions to bring on a second cohort to assist in our efforts. • Updated internal objectives to better reflect our data efforts, as well as our facility outreach efforts.



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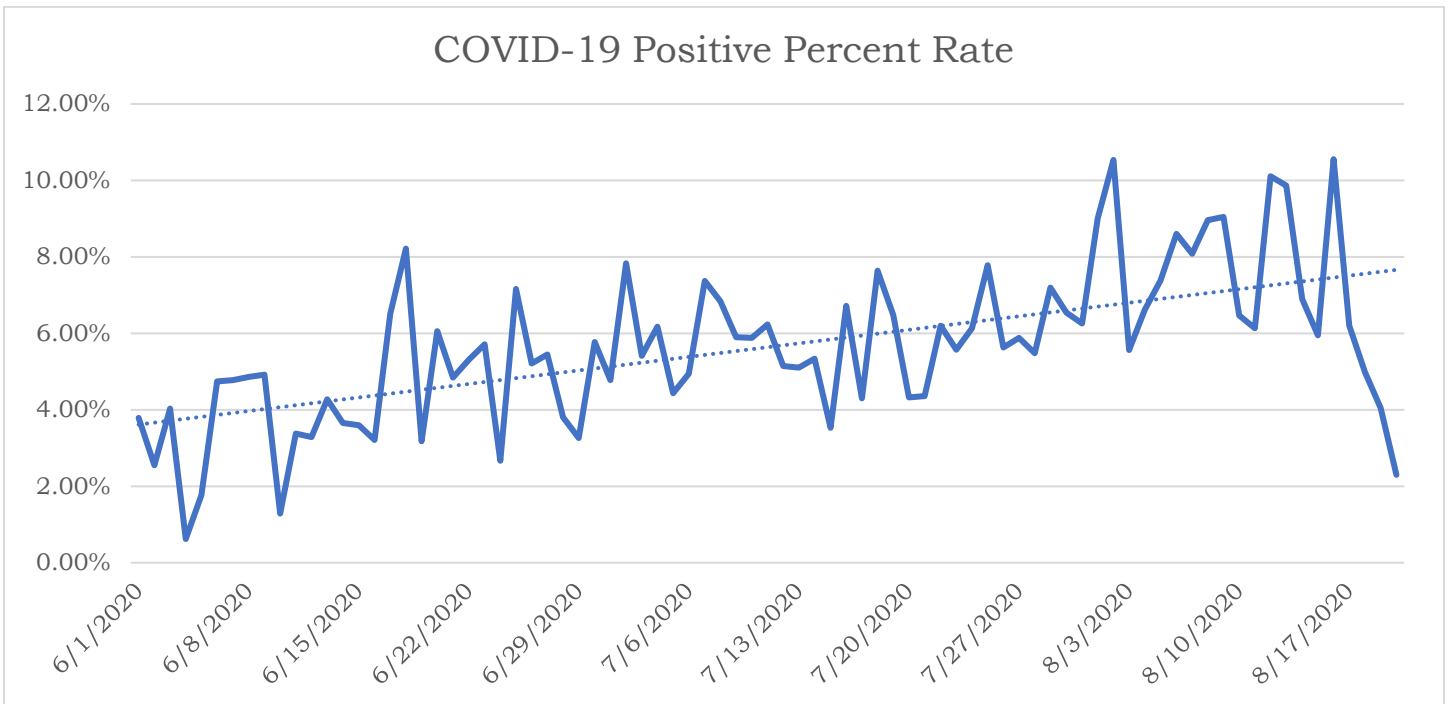
Notes: Intake line operates Monday-Friday 8:00 am-4:30 pm M-F.

The average number of customer contacts per day decreased from 56.2 to 49.6 per day.

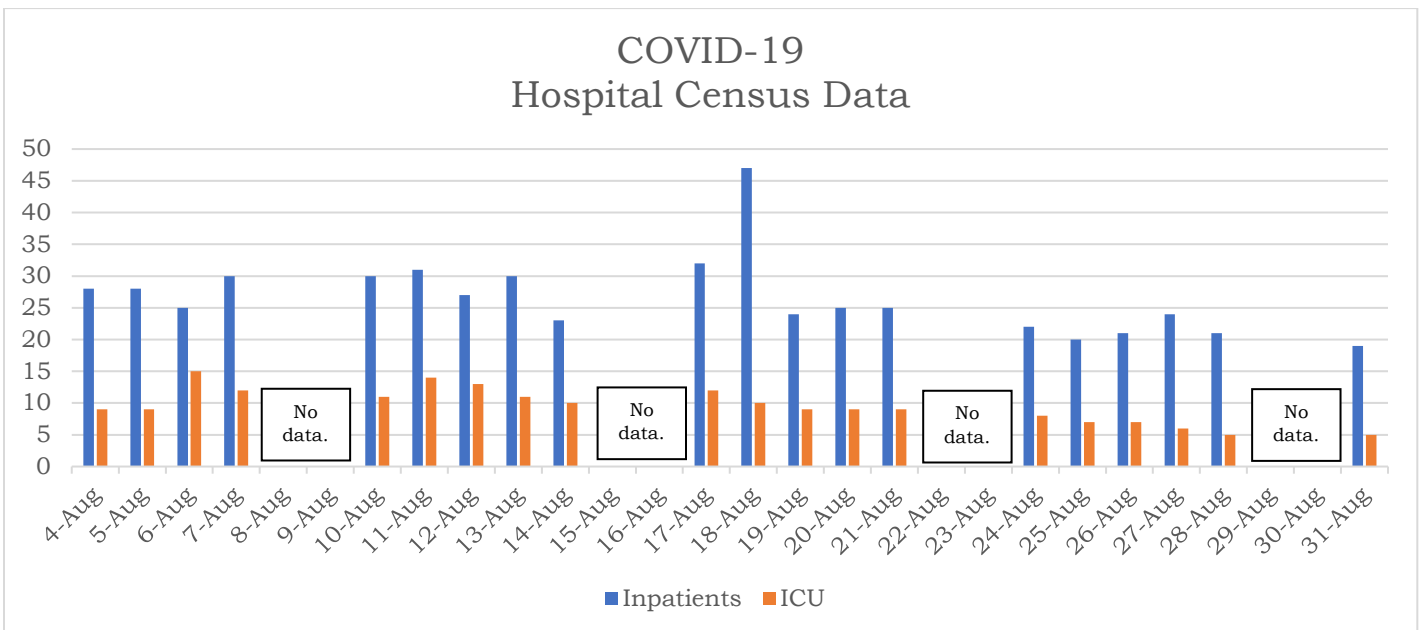

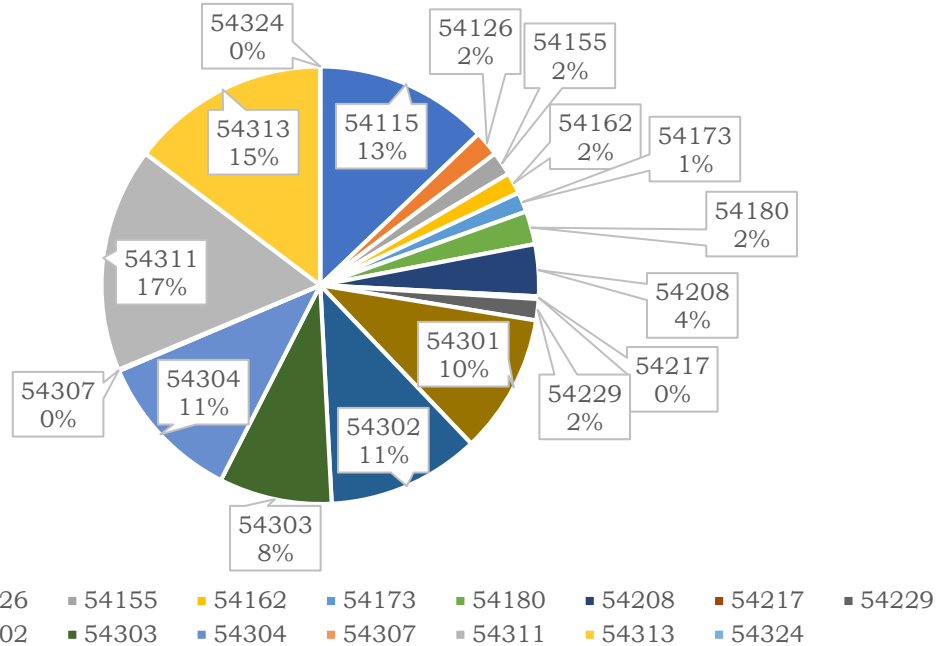

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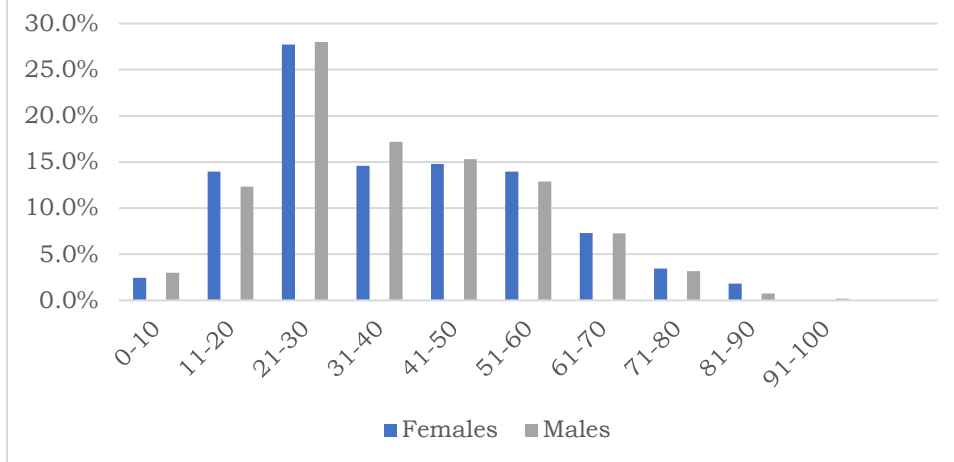
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Confirmed Cases per Zip Code August 2020

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Nursing Weekly Summary

- Continued follow up on COVID-19 cases returned from Department of Health Services.
- Continued to work closely with environmental health and facilities outreach to bring nursing perspective to recommendations.
- Assigned 92 facilities to nursing staff for follow up.
- Participated in a meeting to discuss mass influenza clinic planning.

Environmental Health Weekly Summary

- Responded to 44 COVID-19 assistance requests received from facilities.
- Addressed 7 masking complaints from facilities.
- Continued to work with long term care facilities to assist with guidance and testing questions.

Community Engagement Branch Weekly Summary

- Met with WFRV to discuss Prevention Campaign commercial.
