Goals of the Incident Command COVID-19 Response

- Area Command debrief was completed to learn from previous response efforts
- Interim After Action Report drafted and being reviewed
- Website updated with FAQs, IC Weekly Summaries, Multilingual Masking Resource, and August 2020 Reopening Brown County document
- Masking Campaign concept approved and supported by Brown County leadership and is moving into implementation phase
- Coordinated meeting with Brown County area schools to officially roll out flowchart for interfacing with Brown County Public Health and school surveillance system to track illnesses in the schools
- Partnered with the Medical College of WI to provide an overview of Brown County's COVID-19 response to incoming medical students

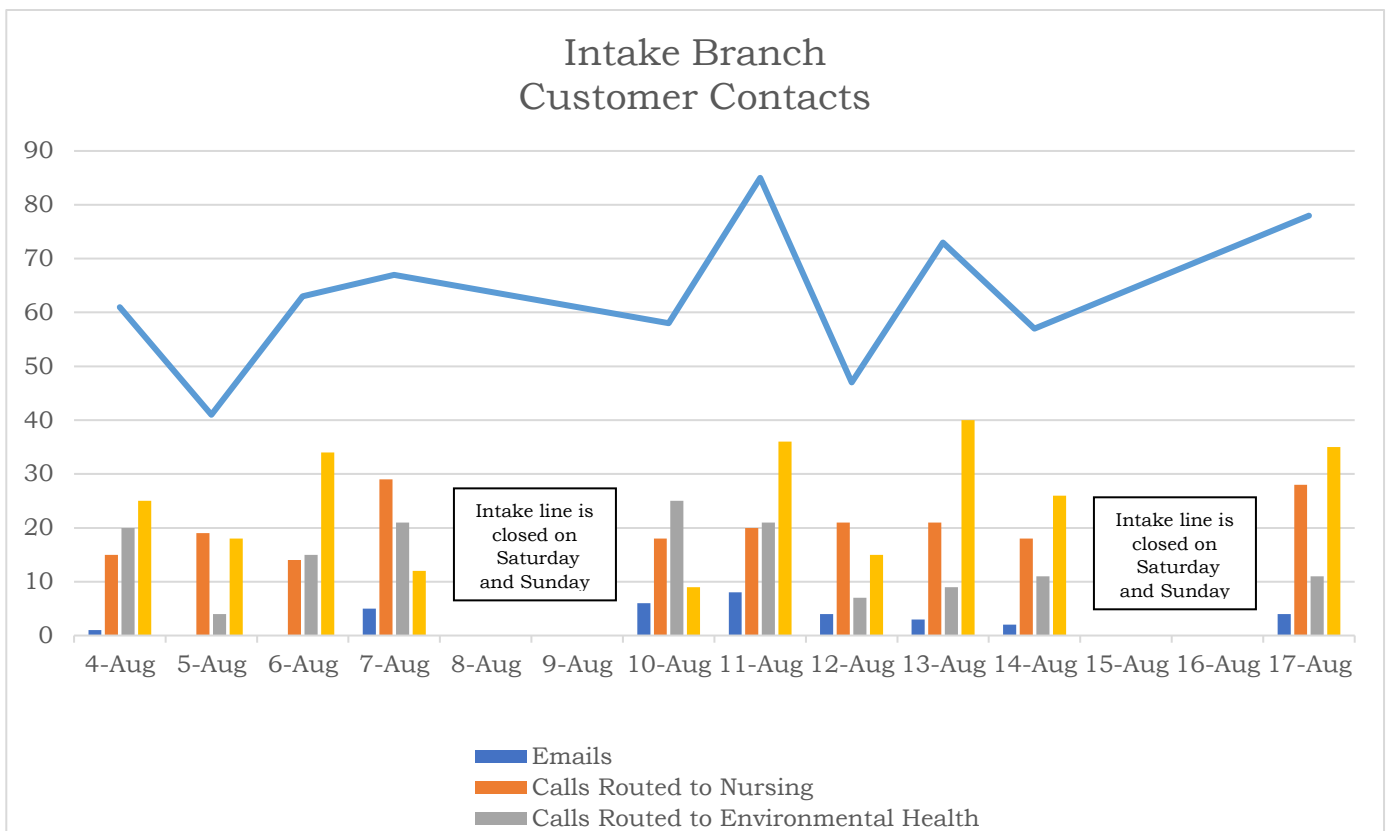

Nursing Weekly Summary

- Full time Brown County Public Health nurses assisted with mentoring and onboarding of newly hired Limited Term Employee Contact Tracers.
- Continued to work closely with Environmental Health and facilities outreach to bring nursing perspective to recommendations.

Environmental Health Weekly Summary

- Held a webinar on best practices for the 2020-2021 school year; including school disease surveillance system, flow chart for what to do if a child becomes ill with COVID-19 and guidance regarding communication with Brown County Public Health.
- Responded to 38 COVID-19 assistance requests received from facilities.
- Continued to work with long term care facilities to assist with guidance and testing questions.

Community Engagement Branch Weekly Summary

- Finalized date for employer virtual town hall, September 3, 1:00-2:00 with Tara Carr, Associate Lecturer and Director of UWGB Small Business Development Center
- Final invite created for ADRC Senior Journaling activity
- Created evaluation and follow up for work with homeless service provider group to address COVID-19 concerns.
