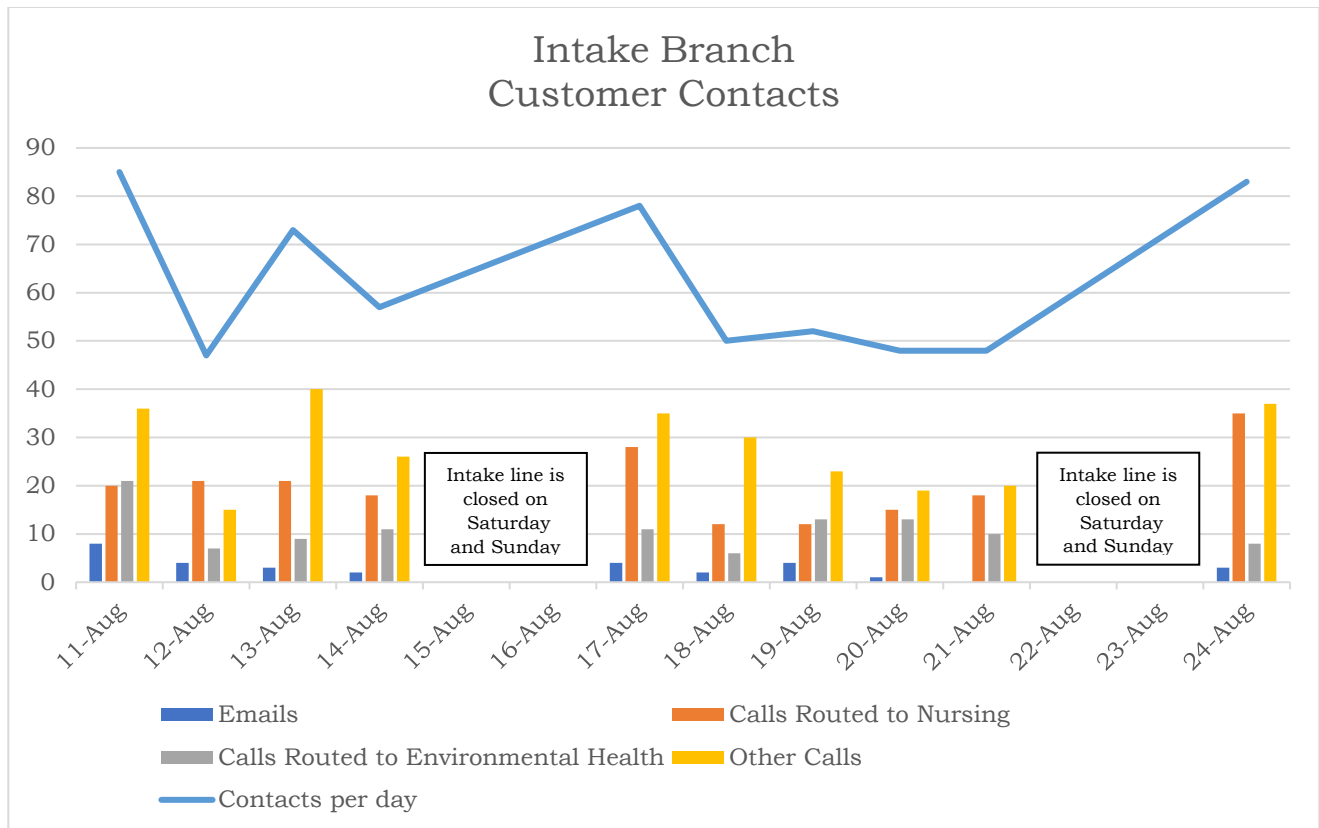

Gaining voluntary compliance with health and safety recommendations	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Prevention messaging campaign was launched with flyers, advertisements through Green Bay Press Gazette and Green Bay Metro Transit. • Initiated discussion with Brown County leadership to determine political will for gated or thresholds for public health recommendations. • Began review of gating recommendations with consideration being given to local data and situation analysis.
Improving internal processes and building capacity	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Continued to develop outbreak management protocols with continuous quality improvements underway • Facilitated a planning meeting to discuss current needs and status of personal protective equipment distribution and storage. • Cross-trained additional staff on WEDSS records staging and processing to reduce time taken to close out cases.

Nursing Weekly Summary

- Continued follow up on COVID-19 cases returned from Department of Health Services.
- Continued to work closely with environmental health and facilities outreach to bring nursing perspective to recommendations.

Environmental Health Weekly Summary

- Crafted a FAQ document to accompany the information and resources provided at the Back to School Webinar offered on August 17th.
- Responded to 66 COVID-19 assistance requests received from facilities.
- Continued to work with long term care facilities to assist with guidance and testing questions.

Community Engagement Branch Weekly Summary

- Met with Voces de la Frontera leadership to discuss COVID-19 impacts for the Latinx community and ways to reduce barriers to testing.
- Presented plan to Beyond Health Steering committee to integrate qualitative data gathered during COVID-19 response into upcoming Community Health Assessment.
