- Governor Evers visited the Lambeau Field Mass Vaccination Site and expressed support for the partnership.
- Completed the After-Action Sustained Response Phase Report for the HERC Region. This report covers the period of August 2020 through February 2021.



Community Engagement Weekly Summary

- Distributed the most up to date vaccine eligibility information to community partners.
- Participated in planning efforts to strategize how to do in-home vaccinations.
- Presented the CHA/CHIP to the focus groups through the YWCA racism and its impacts on health study.
- Participated in discussions regarding demobilization planning for CIQS.

Community Vaccination Weekly Summary

- Met with Bellin Health and the staffing agency to discuss nurse performance and scheduling moving forward.
- Developed a survey to identify area businesses that currently do not have a vaccination plan or connection to a local healthcare provider.
- Completed the DHS equity survey.
- Conducted an onsite assessment at the Lambeau Field Mass Vaccination Site to assess the flow of traffic and clinical procedures.

Environmental Health Weekly Summary

- Assisted school systems and childcare centers with COVID-19 assistance requests.
- Responded to 27 COVID-19 assistance requests from long term care facilities.
- Responded to 2 general COVID-19 related guidance requests from businesses.
