- Jodi Trewin stepped into the CIQS Group Supervisor Role.

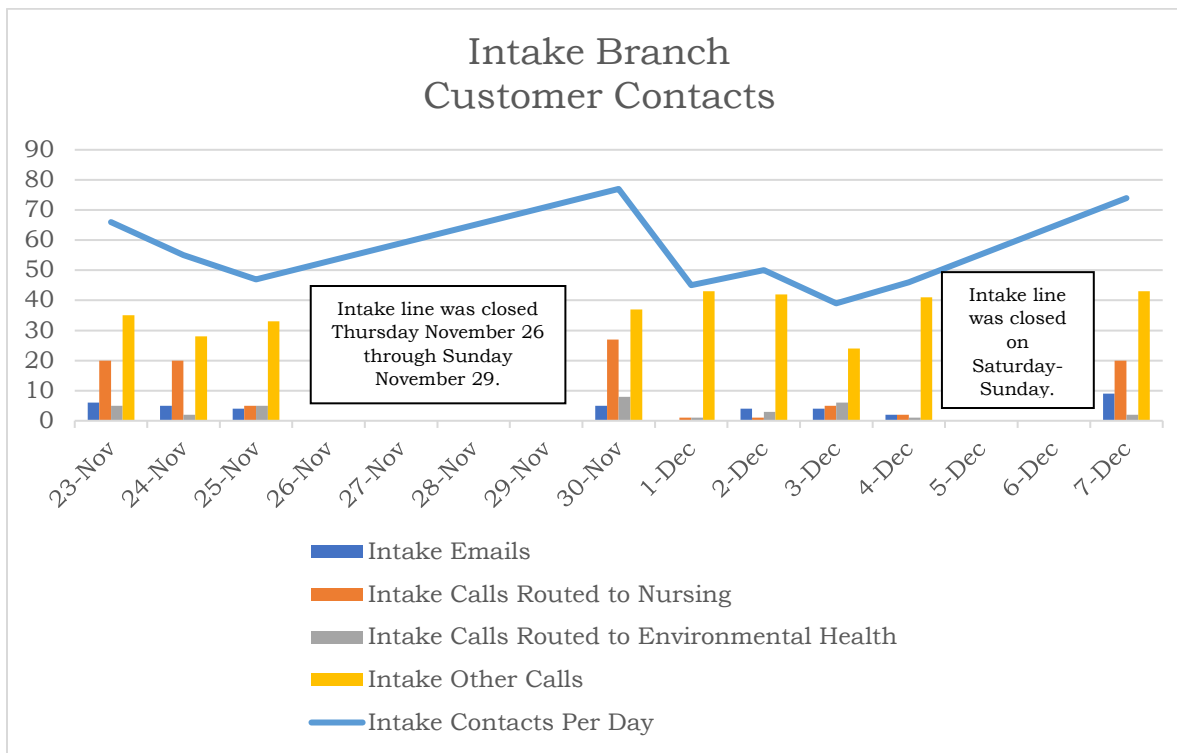
Upcoming Considerations

<p>Gaining voluntary compliance with health and safety recommendations.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Facilitated a virtual contact tracing training to provide community members with the tools and resources they need to assist in our contact tracing efforts. • Updated all public facing and internal documents to reflect the new CDC and DHS quarantine guidance for close contacts. • Collaborated with Bellin and the Packers to hold a joint flu clinic on Saturday December 5. • Finalized guidance for senior citizens, a population at a disproportionate risk of poor health outcomes from COVID-19. • Attended a webinar by the National Association of City and County Health Officials (NACCHO) about continuing the conversation around COVID-19 guidance and recommendations for future vaccination efforts.

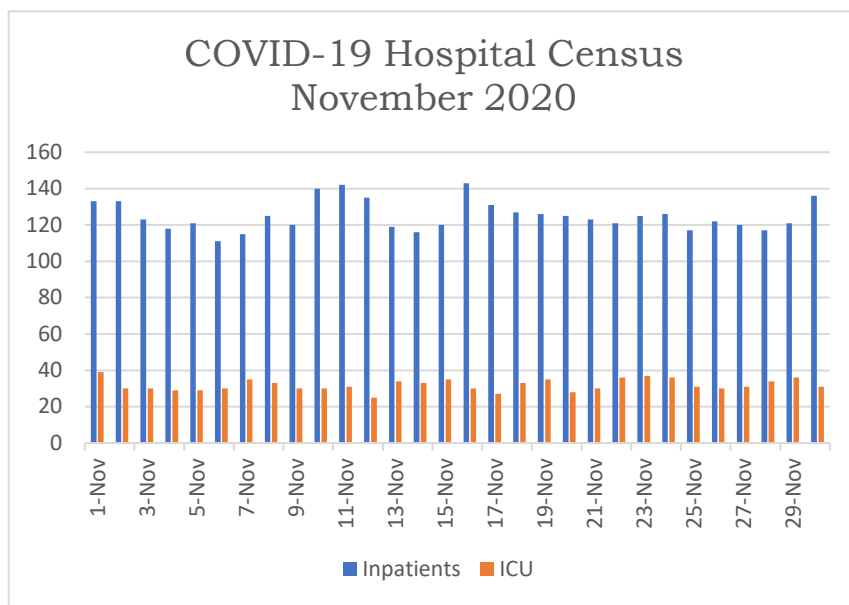
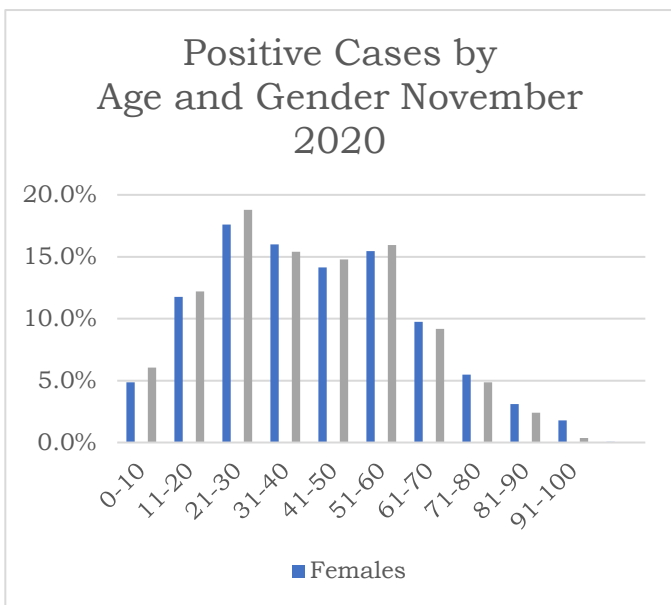

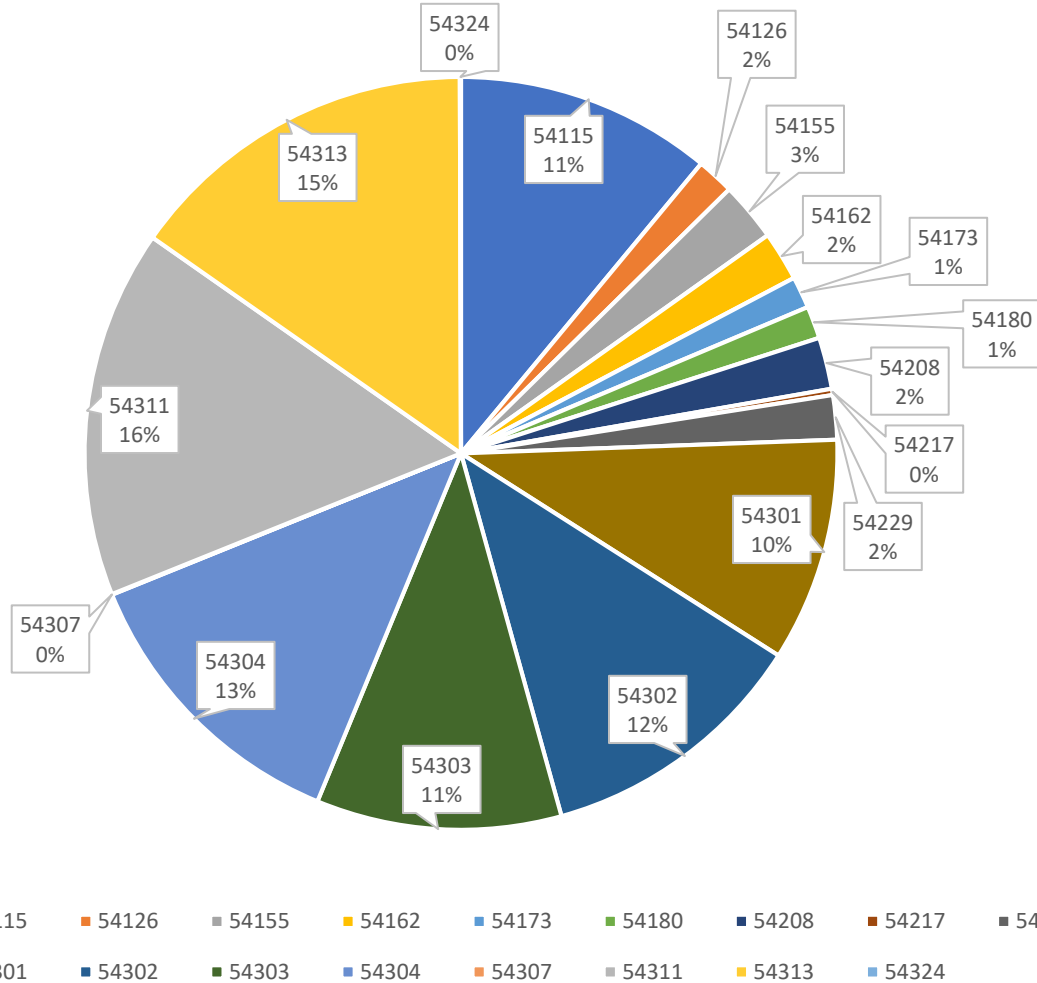
The average number of customer contacts per day decreased 59.67 to 50.8

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Community Engagement Weekly Summary

- Participated in a focus group discussion with the YWCA on racism and health disparities.
- Conducted an assessment with 19 WI counties related to housing needs and their solutions during COVID-19 response.
- Revised and updated the CIQS security phone and contact protocol.
- Followed up with NEW Community Clinic about isolation and vaccination planning.

Community Testing and Vaccination Weekly Summary

- Completed draft of an Executive Summary for Brown County stakeholders outlining the status of COVID-19 vaccine.
- Developed plans for three models--indoor, outdoor (drive-through) and hybrid—for mass vaccination clinics.
- Planning and preparing with local and regional healthcare partners for receipt of COVID-19 vaccine.

Nursing Weekly Summary

- Continued to work closely with Environmental Health and their facilities outreach efforts to bring nursing perspective to recommendations.
- Assigned 25 facilities to nursing staff for follow up.
- Created and monitored an additional 11 outbreaks through Wisconsin Disease Surveillance System (WEDSS).
- Continued routine public health nursing work including lead exposure and routine communicable disease follow up.

Environmental Health Weekly Summary

- Responded to 11 COVID-19 assistance requests received from school systems and childcare centers.
- Responded to 14 COVID-19 assistance requests from long term care facilities.
- Addressed general COVID-19 related guidance requests from businesses.

A Note from Brown County Public Health

Brown County Public Health is urging the community to consider how individual actions like tailgating, dining out at a restaurant, or attending a wedding without taking proper precautions such as physical distancing, or wearing masks, may contribute to increased spread of COVID-19 here in Brown County.

All gatherings and activities involve some level of risk. Wearing a face covering helps protect our communities, including those at higher risk for severe illness and workers who frequently encounter others like nurses, grocers, and first responders.
