- Open a web browser and go to access.wisconsin.gov/access/ and click “Am I Eligible?”.
- Click the “Begin ACCESS” button to continue.
- After you read the Welcome page, click on “Next” to begin.
- You will be asked questions about the people in your home, their income and their bills. Your answers will stay private and secure. You can always click on “Help” if you want to know more about a question.
- When you finish the questions, ACCESS will let you know if you or other people in your home may be eligible for state and federal programs listed above. ACCESS will also let you know how to apply and you will have a chance to print out all of your results.

above require applicants to: be a Wisconsin resident, meet income eligibility guidelines, provide a completed TAP assistance application, provide hearing loss documentation, purchase equipment through an approved vendor, and apply only once every three years.
